## Career Hotspot...Toxicologist

Toxicologists study the harmful effects of chemicals on living organisms by examining the symptoms, mechanisms, treatments and detection of biological poisoning, especially the poisoning of people.

## **Education and Training:**

To become a toxicologist you usually have to study science at university with a major in toxicology and to get into the courses below you usually need to gain your HSC/ACT Year 12. Prerequisite subjects, or assumed knowledge, in one or more of mathematics, physics, chemistry, biology and earth and environmental science are normally required. Various universities have different prerequisites and some have flexible entry requirements. Courses are also offered by distance education. Check for full details with the University of your Choice.

#### **Employment Opportunities:**

Toxicologists are employed across several industries including the pharmaceutical, food and chemical industries, scientific research, government regulatory agencies and other research organisations and health services. 
