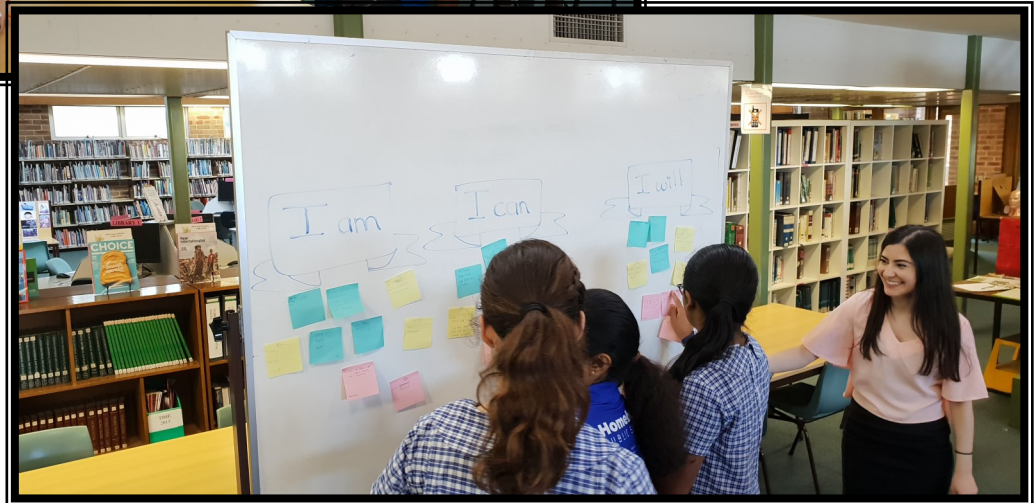


## Being 10: Year 6 Transition with Homebush Primary School

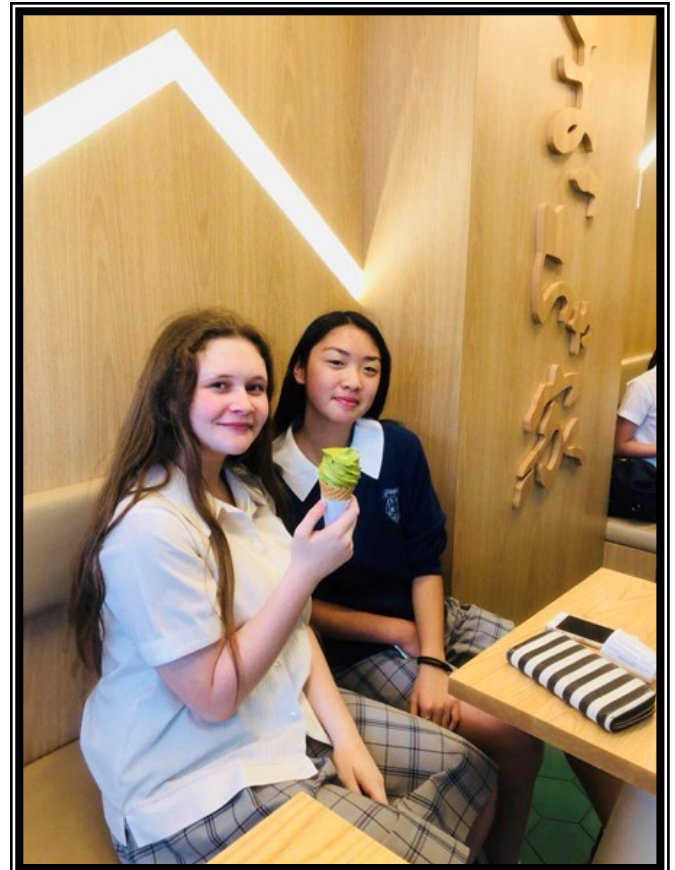
# 2018 Year 8 Japanese B Class Excursion
