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### MATHEMATICS COMPETITIONS

This year, as in previous years, the Mathematics Faculty are giving students the opportunity to enter two external competitions.

The Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC), organised by the Australian Mathematics Trust in Canberra, has been growing in prestige and popularity since it began in 1976.

The ICAS Mathematics Competition, conducted by the University of New South Wales, is a problem-solving competition with a similar format to the AMC.

Both competitions require students to solve a range of mathematical problems, ranging in difficulty from straightforward to challenging. The entry fee for the AMC includes access to an online preparation course which provides students with practice questions. Practice questions for the ICAS competition are not included in the entry fee, but are available for purchase on the ICAS website.

All entrants receive a certificate of participation. Those who perform with merit may be awarded a Credit or Distinction certificate. Last year, we were thrilled to have a Prize winner - Yilin Chen of Year 9.
