SERVICE AWARDS FOR 2018

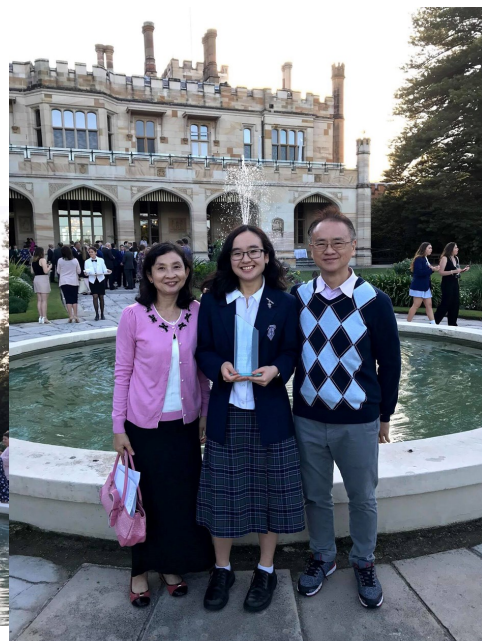
This Award recognises exceptional community service by a Year 11 or 12 student with distinct community involvement and contribution extending beyond the school into the broader local, state, national or even international communities.

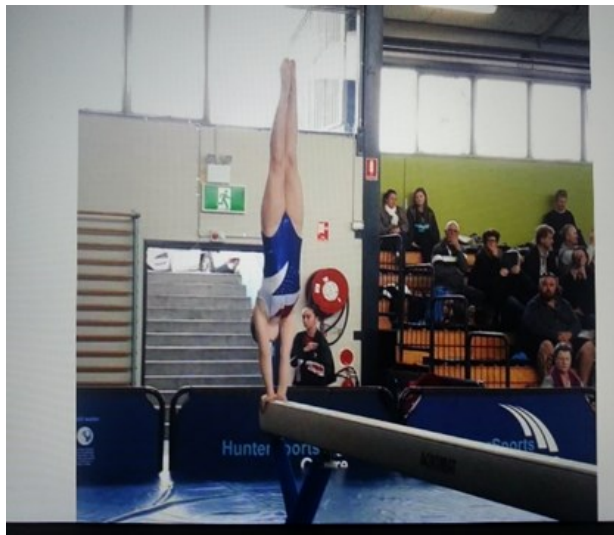

Hapkido

The Year 7 and 8 students have participated in a term of Hapkido from [Korean hapgido \[hap.ki.do\]](#)) which is a [Korean martial art](#), at the Hapkido College of Australia in Croydon. They have learned various self-defence skills and have developed their strength and flexibility.



Tae Kwon Do

Taekwondo was developed during the 1940s and 1950s by Korean martial artists with experience in martial arts such as karate, Chinese martial arts, and indigenous Korean martial arts traditions such as Taekkyeon, Subak, and Gwonbeop.

Ms Suhhee Sirohi has instructed Tae Kwon Do for nearly 20 years during weekly sport sessions at Strathfield Girls High School. The students have advanced through various levels and belts over this time.

Suhhee is a highly qualified and experienced Tae Kwon Do instructor. She was the first female international referee and officiated at the Seoul Olympics and a number of other Korean and international competitions. Suhhee held various director positions in the Korean Tae Kwon Do Federation achieving high regard for women in sport.
