

- Christmas puddings.
- Christmas mince pies.
- UHT Custard (1 litre).
- Shortbread (200g packets).
- Potato chips (large packets).
- Canned tuna/salmon, ham (ring-pull only).

- Canned fruit/vegetables (ring-pull only).
- Lollies (packets).
- Cup-a-noodles.
- Christmas bon-bons.
- Christmas serviettes.
- Bottled water (600ml).
- Fruit juice (1 and 2 litre).

FOOD

- No cooked food (including ham or turkey).
- No raw food.


MISCELLANEOUS

Mobile Detection Cameras from 1 December 2019

Keep your Hands Off It



From 1 December, phone detection cameras will be in operation on NSW roads.

Warning letters relating to camera-detected offences will be issued for the first three months.

Following this period, the penalty for offending drivers is five demerit points and a \$344 fine (\$457 in a school zone).

The penalty increases to 10 demerit points during double demerit periods.
