Girls in Property

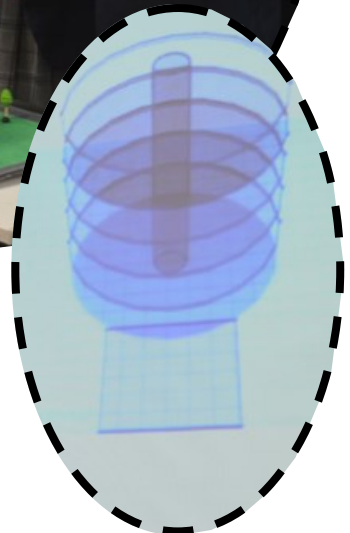
On Tuesday, 11 June 2019, three teams of Year 10 Girls in Property contenders, made their pitch to a panel of industry judges and Ms Lyris. Each team had a different brief about the project on which they had to work. The standard was very high and the presenters were excellent, making the decision very difficult for the judges.

One team presented a design for a proposed dwelling for an Aboriginal family. They took into account Aboriginal culture and affinity to nature and the land in their design of an environmentally friendly dwelling. The second team designed an upgraded Strathfield Girls High School, with a state-of-the-art hall and gym, a retail and café strip below a modern apartment block built on an unused piece of land on the school grounds. The third group presented an excellent design of a modern retail complex, using eco-sustainable and cost-effective features.

After outstanding presentations of their designs and much deliberation by the judges, they announced the winner, the group who presented the upgraded school. This team of girls will now proceed to represent our school at the final interschool event on Thursday, 20 June 2019. We wish them luck in the next stage of the competition.

Teacher advice is a valuable tool to assist you in supporting your daughter to improve her performance and achieve her personal best in the HSC Examinations.


Reminder

Dear Parents/Guardians

On behalf of the P & C Association, we would like to thank the parents and families for the contributions to date which has been spent on much needed resources and improving the well being of the students of the school.

What have we raised to date and where was it spent?

Your building fund donations of previous years, together with additional funds from the P&C contributed \$53,000 towards installation of data projectors, airconditioning to the school hall and library furniture refurbishment - *resources used extensively by all staff and students.*

Year	Amount raised	Appeal for	When and where was the contribution spent?
April 2019	\$2150	Solar My School project	Active project looking for more contributions.
2018	\$2547	Amphitheatre	2018. Spent on the new library furniture as the cost of the new amphitheatre is very expensive - estimated to be \$80,000.
2017	\$3000	Air-conditioning	Allocated for air-conditioning to class rooms.

WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT

We invite you again to make a contribution to Strathfield Girls High School. Your donation will go towards the **installation of a 91kW solar panel system** to lead the way in producing clean green electricity to power our learning facilities.

The solar panels will:

- Slash 26% off our annual energy bills saving the school around \$15k each year on our electricity bill that can be spent towards providing extra education resources

- Power learning facilities with clean, locally produced energy
- Educate our students about renewable energy and climate change solutions and reduce our carbon footprint

The total cost for the installation is estimated to cost approximately \$100,000.

- We've raised \$2150 through the Chuffed online funding campaign
- We've received a \$10,000 grant from Westconnex
- School Infrastructure NSW will commit 50% of the total cost

The school will therefore need to raise approximately \$40,000 to complete the funding to install the 91kW solar panel system. **All money received in this financial drive will be utilised to install the 91kW solar panel system.**

Government funding barely covers the absolute necessities. We request your generosity to cater for the needs of our school. **All donation amounts are welcome. Every bit helps to get us closer to our target.**

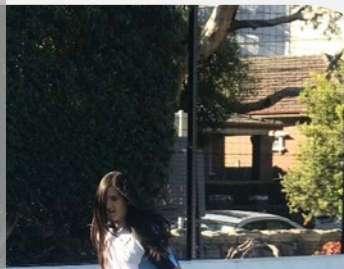
